Priority actions include:

- Improving access to sustainable livelihoods, entrepreneurial opportunities and productive resources;
- Providing universal access to basic social services;
- Developing social protection systems to support those who cannot support themselves;
- Empowering people living in poverty and their organisations;
- Addressing the disproportionate impact of poverty on women;
- Working with donors and recipients to allocate increased shares of ODA to poverty eradication;
- Intensifying international cooperation for poverty eradication.





Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) is an integral element of quality education and a key enabler for sustainable development. The Global Action Programme has identified five priority areas to advance the ESD agenda: policy support, whole-institution approaches, educators, youth, and local communities.





Women suffer from lack of access to decent work and face occupational segregation and gender wage gaps. In many situations, they are denied access to basic education and health care and are victims of violence and discrimination. They are under-represented in political and economic decision-making processes.





Decent work, employment creation, social protection, rights at work and social dialogue are integral to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The UN's Agenda 21 identifies the need to strengthen employment and income-generating programmes as tools to eradicate poverty. The Agenda reiterates the need of generating employment for vulnerable groups, specifically women, urban poor, unemployed rural labour as well as low-income urban residents.

Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels. A specific target of this goal is to end all forms of violence against children and to realise the right of every child to live free from fear, neglect, abuse and exploitation.





This goal recognises multi-stakeholder partnerships as important vehicles for mobilising and sharing knowledge, expertise, technologies and financial resources to support the achievement of the sustainable development goals. It encourages and promotes effective public, public-private and civil society partnerships, building on the experience and resourcing strategies of partnerships.
